## Punctuation and Capitalization

### Instructions:

Show your child the activity sheets and explain that all the sentences are missing capital letters and/or punctuation marks. Help your child read the sentences. Then invite him or her to rewrite each sentence with the correct capitalization and punctuation.

### Helpful Hint:

Remind your child that proper nouns—the names of people, places, and things—begin with capital letters. Explain that months of the year and days of the week begin with capital letters, too. Finally, remind your child that all sentences end with a punctuation mark (period, question mark, or exclamation point).
